From the Pastor's Desk



This Sunday we celebrate Mother's Day, a way of recognizing all mothers in the world for all they do for us. They love us and take care of all our needs. Everything they do to make us happy like waking up early in the morning to prepare our meals, cleaning the house to put things in order, going to work so they can provide us with our basic needs, and all the other many things they do for us is why we can say that our mom is the best mom in the world—she provides us with all our needs.

Now having experienced all this from our moms, what do we do in return to show our appreciation and gratitude for what they do for us? Should we not treat them special, especially on Mother's Day?

How? Maybe by giving her flowers, gifts, cards or taking her out to dinner. Then we can hug and kiss her as a way of saying thank you. These are all good expressions of love and appreciation. And our moms certainly deserve that. However, I think more than these acts of love and appreciation, our mothers deserve the following to be given not only on Mother's Day, but everyday:

Obedience - In his letter to the Ephesians, St. Paul said: "children, obey your parents in the Lord for this is right." (Ephesians 6:1) Even Jesus obeyed his mother. In obedience comes blessing.

Respect - Again, St. Paul said: Honor your father and mother, which is the first commandment, with a promise that it may go well with you and that you may have a long life on earth. (Eph 6:2) When we give respect and honor to our parents, what we receive in return is again a blessing – long life.

Affection - Elisha demonstrated the affection properly due to her parents. She kissed her mother and father goodbye before she followed Elijah (1King 19:20). And why not when they gave us so much affection as children, don't they deserve affection in return? Such affection can be given in words ("I love you, Mom!"), hugs, gifts, etc.

Care - Parents, especially widowed mothers, deserve our care. St. Paul said if a widow has children and grandchildren, let these first learn to perform their religious duty to their own family and to make recompense to their parents for this is pleasing to God – (1 Tim. 5:4)

Indeed, children have to take care of their parents. They deserve the best care we can afford to give them after they took care of us. Some may require professional and medical care, but we should not simply drop them off at nursing homes just for our convenience.

Question: Do we give our mothers the OBEDIENCE, RESPECT, AFFECTION and CARE they deserve?

 **Pentecost Sunday** is next Sunday, May 15th and is referred to as the celebration of the birth of the church. This was the day when the Holy Spirit descended upon the first disciples. Because the Holy Spirit is symbolized by the tongues of fire, the liturgical color for Pentecost is "red". ***In honor of this celebration, we invite all parishioners to wear their "red" next weekend.*** It is also a tradition here at St. Mary's to decorate the sanctuary of our church for Pentecost Sunday. Red Geranium forms are located at all the church entrances. Forms and money may be placed in a marked envelope (Geraniums) and placed in the collection basket or dropped off at the Administrative Center **no later than 12:00 Noon, Monday, May 9th.** Flowers may be taken home immediately following the 11:00 A.M. Mass on Pentecost Sunday.



DEDICATION

A new addition to our church property will soon be dedicated. Father Dominick A. DeBlasio, a native son of St. Mary's Parish family who passed away on November 10th, 2014 at the age of 101, generously bequested our parish his property that is in near proximity to our church property. The house that was on the property was in poor condition and was demolished in November of last year. The detached garage is in the process of being spruced up and the property has been backfilled and is now being beautified to become the "Father Dom Prayer Garden". We hope to utilize this "green space" as a reflective area for our CCD students, our teen ministry, our Christian Mothers and various other groups in the parish. It is still a work in process, but we wish to thank David and Cleatus Burk for their generous donation of their time in planting various bushes, trees and plants and offering to maintain these various gardens in the future. We also wish to thank the Christian Mothers for the donation of the Japanese Maple tree as well as many others who have donated both plants and monetary donations. Please plan on joining us this coming Saturday, May 14th as we plan to dedicate this very special addition to our parish campus. At 3:15 in the afternoon, the Christian Mothers will gather to recite the rosary, and they invite the parish to join them. And at 3:45, Father Ron will formally bless the prayer garden and invite those in attendance to the 4:00 Mass.
