Fr. Elmer Kacinko – who celebrated his 55th Priestly Anniversary May 27th, 2016

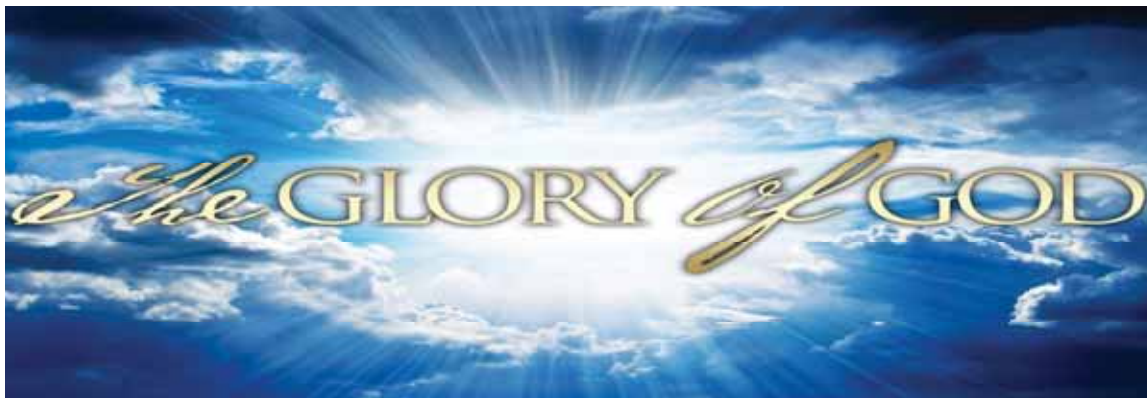
Fr. James Goldberg – who celebrated his 40th Priestly Anniversary May 1st, 2016

The Parish Council met the third week of May and even though many items were discussed, there seemed to be a common thread between most of the items - the fact that so many individuals volunteer to make us the growing family parish we are. I could not begin listing names or activities, but it extends from the help around the facilities to our youth, to our homebound and everything in between. We talk about Time, Talent and Treasure – St. Mary's is blessed with generous individuals in all three. As you know, our DLA was very successful and Phase 1 of the Church AC has already been completed. As I discussed last time, Phase 2 will be the replacement of the air handler located above the ceiling in the choir loft. This portion of the Air Conditioner Upgrade is much larger than the condenser unit replacement in Phase 1. Since the air handler has been serviced regularly and has an estimated life of 5 to 6 years, we will continue to save a portion of money each year so that when it is needed, the money will be available. Our 190th Anniversary activities will continue throughout the summer with a special Teen Mass and events at this year's Vacation Bible Camp. Freeport Theatre Festival will be featuring the origination of St. Mary's Parish in their second play of the summer season beginning in Mid-August. The name of the play is "Spirit of St. Mary's" and it will celebrate the spirit of those men and women whose lives and struggles became the bricks and mortar of our parish. The play is written and directed by parishioner *Rennick Steele*. A definite must see! We are coordinating with Bishop Edward Malesic so that he can be a part of our 190th Anniversary Mass on September 7th followed by a dinner in our Fellowship Hall – save the date! Divine mercy

Learning about Divine Mercy Week 1

Let's begin with Saint Faustina and her role in God's plan to speak about Divine Mercy. St Mary Faustina Kowalska was born on August 25th, 1905 in Poland, to a poor, religious family of peasants, the third of ten children. At the age of 16, she left home and went to work as a housekeeper in order to support herself and to help her parents. Called during a vision of the suffering Christ on August 1st, 1925, she entered the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy and took the name Sister Mary Faustina. The Lord Jesus chose Sister Mary Faustina as the apostle and "secretary" of his mercy so that she could tell the world about his great message. "In the Old Covenant", he said to her, "I sent prophets wielding thunderbolts to my people. Today I am sending you with my mercy to the people of the whole world. I do not want to punish aching mankind, but I desire to heal it, pressing it to my merciful Heart" (Diary 1588).
