



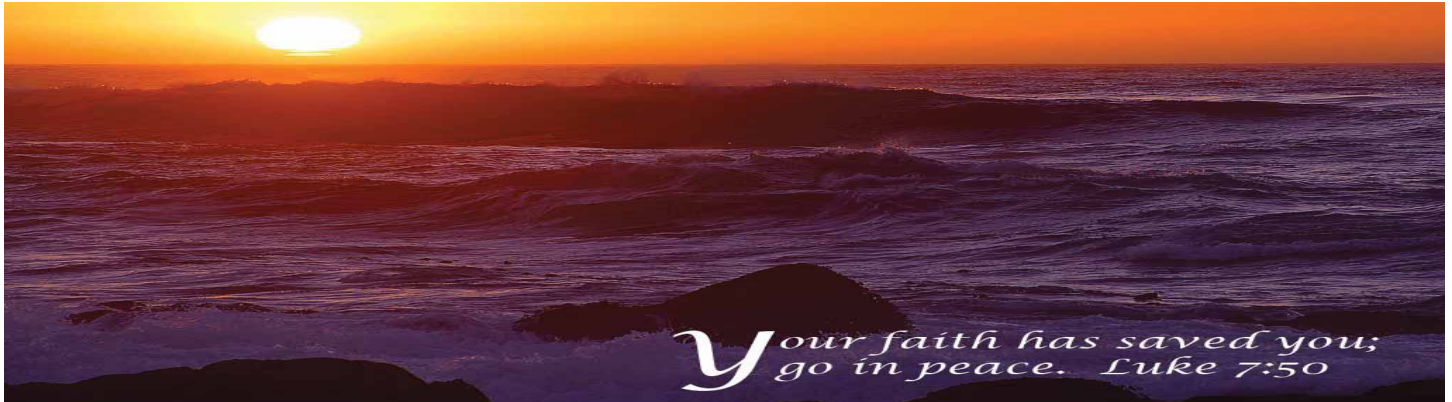

Learning about Divine Mercy
Week 2

Divine
mercy

"In the beginning..."(Genesis 1:1) we read about God's glorious creation and man's inglorious sin, in that the serpent tempts, Adam fails and Eve succumbs, then both of them are fearful, causing them to run and hide. The Old Testament is a record of a long and arduous journey where God continually taught the Israelites about who He was.... not someone to run from out of fear, but run to with contrite hearts to receive his mercy. He was the bridegroom untiringly chasing his bride.

In the New Testament, God's revelation of his love and mercy become "enfleshed" in Jesus Christ. "When the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son... to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons."
