## Learning about Divine Mercy Week 7



*Let's continue with the Chaplet of Divine Mercy: We said that it is an extension of the moment in the Mass when Jesus becomes, truly becomes present on the altar.*

*On the small rosary beads we pray, "For the sake of His sorrowful passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world." The chaplet is not a substitute for mass, but more like an ECHO that does not die away...we become and participate in a part of the liturgy that never ceases on earth. Out of love for Jesus, our Savior, therefore, we pray to the Father that all that Jesus suffered for us might not be wasted, but might bring about our salvation. Notice that the Chaplet is not a self-centered prayer. It does not say "have mercy on me," but instead says "have mercy on us" and "on the whole world". Saying the Chaplet, therefore, is not just an exercise of personal piety: rightly understood, it is in itself a work of mercy! "My daughter, encourage souls to say the Chaplet... unceasingly" (From the Diary of St. Faustina)*

Those who signed up receive three emails per week for seven weeks, with the last week ending Thursday, August 4th. 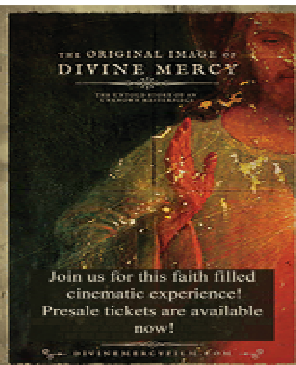

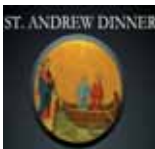
