From the Pastor's Desk



For most of the world, the Solemnity of the Epiphany, which is the manifestation of Jesus Christ to the gentiles (world) as represented by the magi, is celebrated on the 12th day after Christmas. For dioceses of the United States, we celebrate the Solemnity this Sunday. The three magi, Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar, followed the star to Bethlehem to adore the new born King. They brought gifts of *gold* because the Child was a King, *frankincense* because the Child was God, and *myrrh* because the Child was destined to be a sacrifice. Since before the middle ages, Catholics would bless their houses by inscribing, with blessed chalk, the initials of the three kings above their doorways. It symbolizes the family's commitment to welcome Christ into their homes throughout the year.

The pastor normally would go through the parish neighborhoods bringing holy water and chalk in hand-blessing homes and marking the portals. But knowing how this would be hard to do for a day, the head of the family can do the blessing of their home. The father inscribes the initials and each child can mark the crosses. Mom can stand by with holy water. It is traditions like these that we build our *Roman Catholic Identity*. When we know who we are, we can more effectively share the gift with others.

Here is one form of an Epiphany House Blessing:

Leader: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Response:** Amen

Leader: Peace be to this house and to all who dwell here, in the name of the Lord. **Response:** Blessed be God forever.

Leader: A reading from the holy gospel according to St. John. **Response:** Glory to You, O Lord

In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came to be through him, and without him nothing came to be..... And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth. (John 1:1-3.14)

Leader: The Gospel of the Lord. **Response:** Praise to you O Lord Jesus Christ!

Let us pray: (*Christus Mansionem Benedicat.*) May Christ bless this house! **Response:** Amen.

Leader: We sign this doorway with four crosses and the numerals of the New Year:

20 + C + M + B + 17

After the prayers of the blessing are recited, each room of the home is sprinkled with holy water. The year and initials of the Magi are inscribed above the doors with the blessed chalk (Casper, Melchior and Balthasar with the first two numerals of the year preceding the C and the last two numerals of the year placed after the B).

Leader: Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. May we be blessed with health, goodness of heart, gentleness and the keeping of your law. Fill us with the light of Christ that our love for each other may go out to all. We ask this through Christ our Lord. **Response:** Amen.

From the Pastor's Desk

(Each room of the house is sprinkled with holy water)

Living Room

Leader: You are present where two or three are gathered. Bless this room, O Lord.

Response: Amen

Kitchen

Leader: Give us daily bread. Bless this room, O Lord. **Response:** Amen

Dining Room

Leader: May we be seated at the heavenly banquet. Bless this room O Lord. **Response:** Amen

Bedrooms

Leader: Protect us, stay with us through the night. Bless this room. **Response:** Amen

Bathroom

Leader: You cleanse us always from sin. Bless this room. **Response:** Amen

(All return to the living room to pray together)

Leader: Let us pray as Jesus taught us: **All:** Our Father.....

Then the leader sprinkles all present with holy water and concludes:

Leader: Bless this household through all days to come, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, now and forever. **All:** Amen.

Note: Blessing the Chalk

If you cannot obtain blessed chalk, it is permissible for the head of the household to bless chalk to be used. Here is a simple formula:

V. Our help is the name of the Lord. **R.** Who made heaven and earth.

Let us pray.

Bless, O Lord God, this creature chalk to render it helpful to your people. Grant that they who use it in faith and with it inscribe upon the doors of their homes the names of your saints, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar, may through their merits and intercession enjoy health of body and protection of soul.

Through Christ our Lord.

And the chalk is sprinkled with Holy Water.
